Engage in thought provoking discussion, technical updates and networking take place regularly at locations around Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire.


The Chatham House Rule applies, so you can speak freely with your peers and knowledgeable presenters about issues that affect you and your business. These evening events are often followed by a light meal.
