	To work with the ICAEW Regional Director and regional team to create a strategy to support all the above, whilst working collaboratively with the neighbouring networks across the wider regions.

	Within this role you will help the ICAEW grow the organisation and its profile, reputation and influence, and enhance the benefits we offer to our members.
	You will be able to share knowledge and actively support initiatives aimed at promoting ethical practices and professional excellence.

	All Board members are responsible for attending meetings prepared to meaningfully participate and share their experience, knowledge and skills and, at all times. to make purposeful and positive contributions.
	Applications from recently qualified members are welcome.
	You will be required to declare any conflicts of interest. (Please note: all members act in a personal capacity and do not act as representatives of the organisation they work in).
Time commitment: no of meetings per annum and length of	The recommended number of meetings per year is 4 virtual meetings and 1 physical meeting. Please note that during the first year it is anticipated that additional meetings may be required.
meeting	Additional matters for decision or noting may be circulated out of Board.
	It is expected that Board members, where possible, attend all meetings and read agenda paperwork prior to the meeting.
	A board member of the local network board may be removed from the board if they are absent from three or more consecutive meetings and if they do not actively participate or contribute to discussions during meetings.
Remuneration:	This is a voluntary, unpaid position.
Meeting location:	At present most meetings are being held virtually. There may be a requirement in the future to attend meetings at Chartered Accountants' Hall in London or other UK venues when required.
