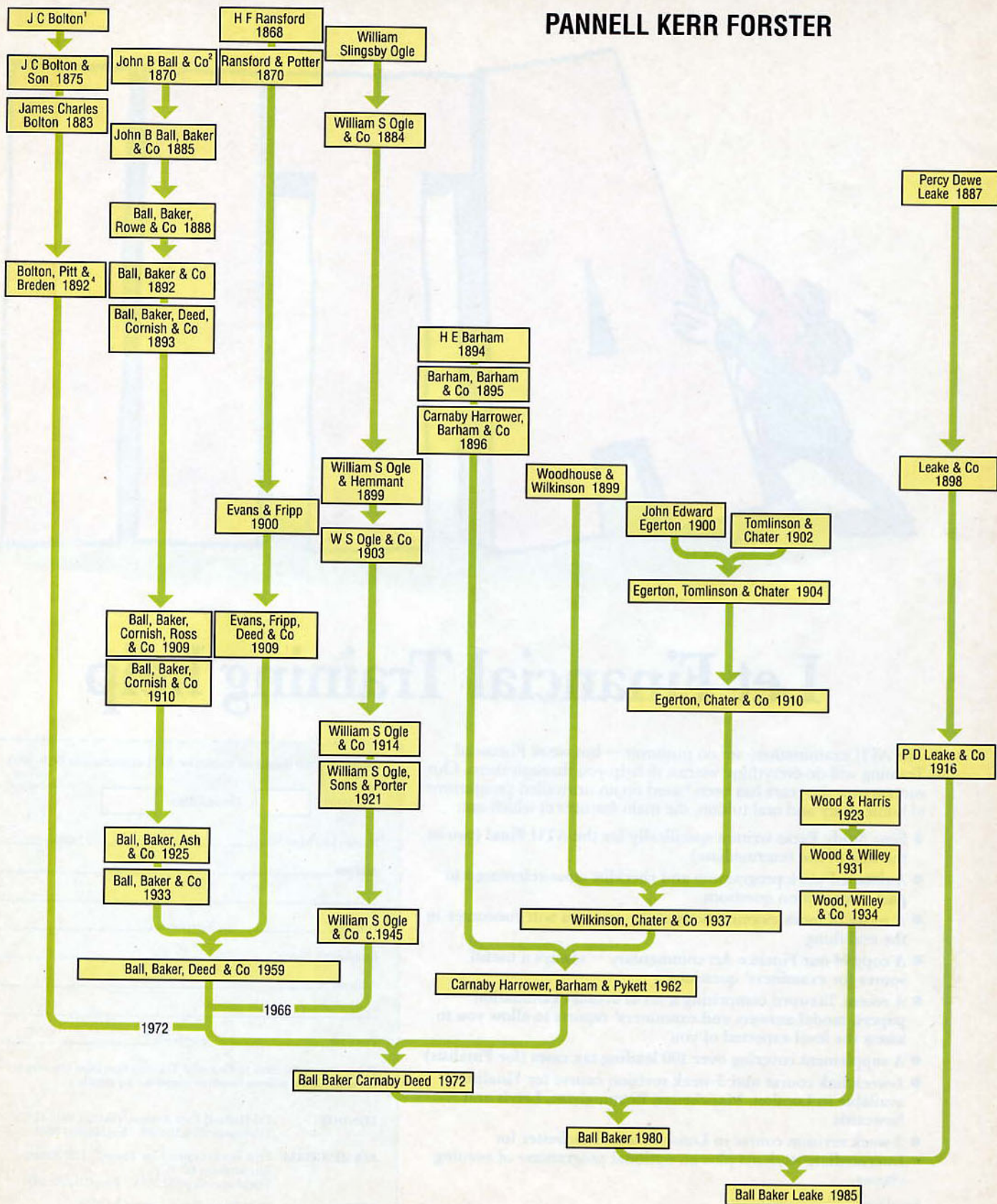

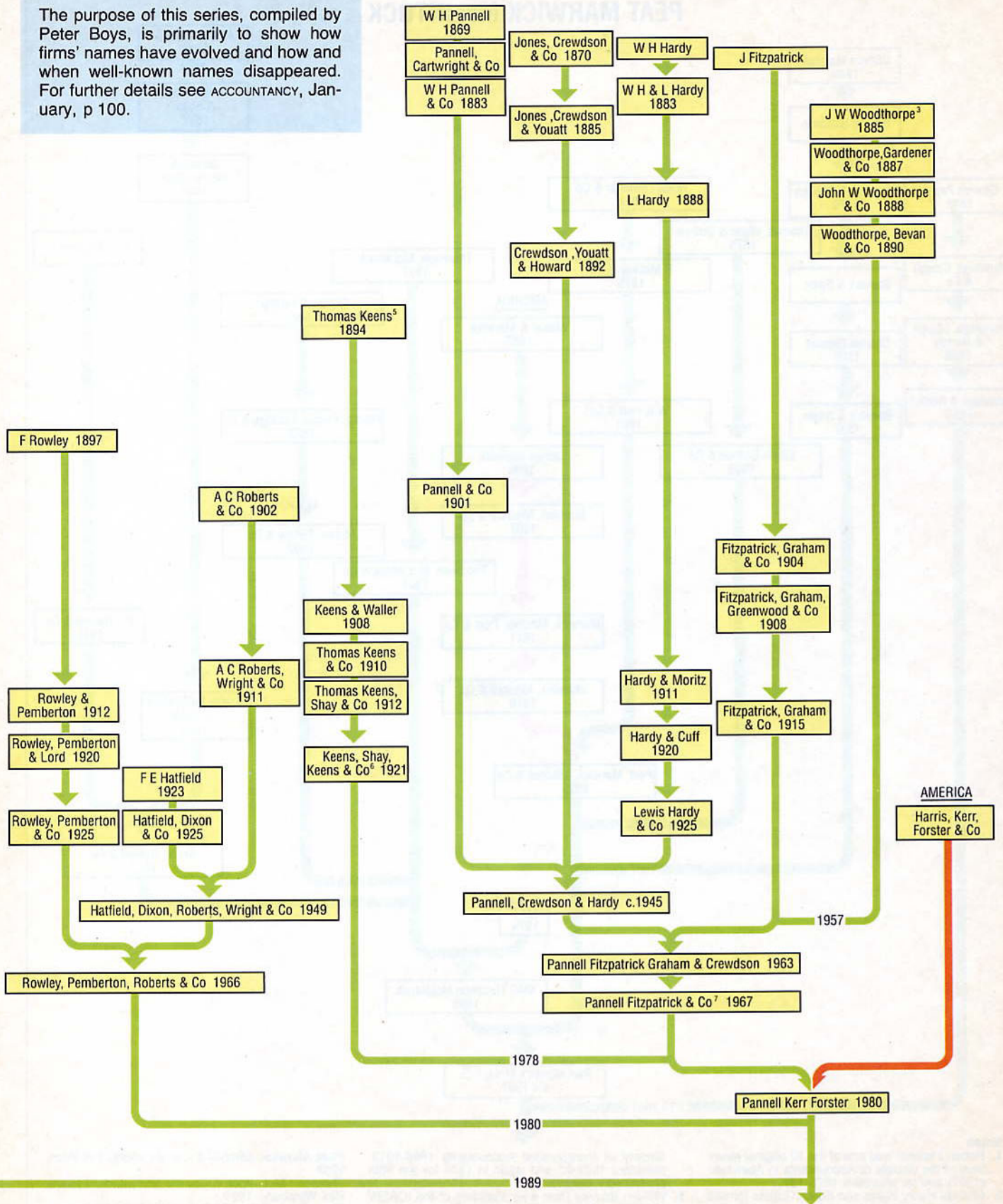

6. Thomas Keens, later Sir Thomas was president of the Society of Incorporated Accountants 1926-29.
7. The Liverpool practice of Lithgow, Nelson & Co was

acquired in 1972. Bertram Nelson CBE was president of the Society of Incorporated Accountants 1954-56 and his father, Charles Hewetson Nelson, was president 1913-16. Lithgow, Nelson & Co continues as the name of a practice based in London and Southport.

became an associated firm of Pannell Fitzpatrick & Co in 1972. George Walter Knox, later Sir George, was a member of the first Council of the Sheffield Institute of Accountants (1877), a member of the first Council of the ICAEW and its president 1896-97. The name of Knox survives in the London practice of Knox Cropper.
