


PKF Littlejohn LLP Family Tree



- (1) Ernest Littlejohn established a book-keeping practice for Lloyd's of London syndicates in 1875, a market the Firm has been associated with ever since
- (2) Josiah Beddow was a member of the first Council of the ICAEW
- (3) James Todd was probably the first practice to open an office in Moscow in 1912 which lasted until 1931
- (4) F R M de Paula CBE is perhaps better known for the time he spent as Professor of Accounting at the London School of Economics (1926-29) and with the Dunlop Rubber Company (1930-1941), and for his publications. He was the first non-practising member of the Council of the ICAEW (1943-1950)
- (5) Thorne, Lancaster & Co re-emerged in 1978 as an Independent firm. In 1985, it merged with Cooper Basden & Adamson to form Cooper Lancaster. It re-emerged in 1991 and now practises as Thorne Lancaster Parker
- (6) CLB continues to practise independently in the North West as CLB Coopers
- (7) J R Linn & Co emerged from the tax department of Donner Underwriting Agencies
- (8) Geoffrey Martin & Co practises as PKF Geoffrey Martin & Co Limited
- (9) The Firm joined PKF International, a global network of legally independent firms in 2013
